## New Dubai arrival requirements \*200421

Dear Trade Partner,

Please note that effective 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2021, passengers travelling from India to Dubai must hold a negative COVID-19 PCR certificate for a test conducted no more than **48 hours** prior to the time of departure.

Additionally, laboratory results will only be accepted from authorised labs that generate a **QR Code** linked to the original report.

The following existing test exemptions still apply:

- UAE nationals are exempt from taking a COVID-19 PCR test before departing to Dubai. They will be tested on arrival in Dubai.
- Children under the age of 12 and passengers who have a moderate or severe disability are exempt from taking a COVID-19 PCR test

Passengers arriving into DXB from certain countries (click here to check <u>list of</u> countries) will be required to take another PCR test on arrival at DXB.

Emirates flexible re-booking policy provides customers more opportunities to use their unused tickets or to book tickets for future plans. In addition Emirates continues to offer the <u>multi-risk travel insurance</u> to keep all our customers safe on their journeys and giving them extra security wherever they are in the world.
