

How to show you're fully vaccinated when flying to England from a non-Red list country.

Fully vaccinated against COVID-19 through an approved vaccination programme?

If you choose to declare vaccinated status on your Passenger Locator Form to enter England, you'll need to present an approved paper or digital vaccine certificate.

The proof you use will depend on where your vaccine(s) were administered. For all the latest info about the measures you must follow to enter England and details of UK Government-approved vaccines for travel and recognised countries, you must visit GOV.UK.

Some of the most common vaccine certificates include:



Vaccinated in the **UK**



Digital NHS COVID Pass via the NHS App not the NHS COVID-19 contact tracing app



NHS COVID Pass PDF or Letter via the NHS app, NHS.uk or call 119



The hand-written vaccination record card cannot be accepted



Vaccinated in the **United States**



An original physical US CDC card (sorry, no photocopies or scans) **and proof of US residency** such as US passport, US visa, Green Card or driver's license



Vaccinated in the **European Union**



EU Digital COVID Certificate



The final dose must have been at least 14 days prior to travel



Book and pay for a PCR test before you fly – to be taken on or before Day 2 of arrival in England. This will be replaced by a lateral flow test for fully vaccinated arrivals in late October



Fill in your Passenger Locator Form (PLF) available via GOV.UK within 48 hours of departure, and before you travel to the airport, adding your test booking reference

55 other countries' vaccination programmes are now recognised by the UK Government for entry to England. Within our airline network these include:



Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Grenada, Hong Kong, India, Israel, Jamaica, Nigeria, Pakistan, South Africa, St Lucia and St Vincent.

You'll need to show an original document (digital or paper-based) from a national or state-level public health body that shows you're fully vaccinated.

If you've been in a Red list country in the previous 10 days, you'll need to follow a different set of rules, irrespective of vaccination status. Visit gov.uk/travel-abroad
