RE: MALAYSIA AIRLINES INCREASES CAPACITY FLIGHTS TO SYDNEY AND MELBOURNE FOR FULLY VACCINATED TRAVELLERS ONLY

Following the recent announcement by the Australian, NSW and VIC Governments on the resumption of international travel for fully vaccinated travellers, Malaysia Airlines is pleased to inform you that we are increasing flights and capacity from Kuala Lumpur to Sydney and Melbourne from 1st November 2021.

Customers from Kuala Lumpur must fulfil the following criteria to travel to Sydney or Melbourne, effective November 2021 :

- Only fully vaccinated Australian citizens, residents and immediate family members are permitted to travel, without exception.
- All travellers aged 12 and over who have received all required doses of a recognised vaccine as per TGA guidelines are permitted to enter Australia
- The following are the approved/recognised vaccine by The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA):
 - Pfizer Australia Pty Ltd (Comirnaty)
 - AstraZeneca Pty Ltd (Vaxzevria)
 - Janssen-Cilag Pty Ltd (COVID-19 Vaccine Janssen)
 - Moderna Australia Pty Ltd. (Spikevax)
 - Coronavac (Sinovac)
 - Covishield (AstraZeneca/Serum Institute of India)

(Note: mixed vaccines are not recognised. The final dose must have been completed at least seven (7) days before departure.)

- All travellers will need to show proof of vaccination status at airport check-in on departure.
- Unvaccinated children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult who is fully vaccinated. Meanwhile, Australian citizens and Permanent Residents aged 12 to 17 travelling to Sydney, Melbourne and accompanied by a parent or guardian who is fully vaccinated can travel unvaccinated. Those who are not “fully vaccinated” will be required to undergo mandatory home quarantine and testing for those aged 12 to 17 in accordance with ATAGI guidelines.
- All incoming travellers must provide evidence of a negative pre-departure PCR test result taken no more than 3 days before the scheduled time of departure
