Dear India Trade and Travel Partners,

Effective **27th Jul 2022**, the following restrictions are applicable to check-in baggage for passengers travelling to/from Indian Sub-Continent: Indian Sub-Continent includes India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh.

1. Cardboard boxes shall not be accepted as check-in baggage even if the carton box is within the linear dimension of 158cm. Note: this is NOT applicable if pax is travelling to/from Bahrain/KSA/Kuwait and Indian Sub-Continent.

2. Only suitcases or cardboard boxes (wherever accepted as per point 1) that meet the maximum specific dimensions (51cm x 31cm x 76cm) are accepted as check-in baggage.

3. Any item of baggage exceeding 158cms but is less than 215cms shall be considered as 'Over Size' baggage and must be charged as an extra piece of baggage. 'Oversized' ancillary charge will be filed under sub-code 0ID 'Excess Size'.

4. Baggage exceeding the linear dimensions of 215cms shall not be accepted. Due to limited hold capacity, 'Out of Gauge' (OOG) baggage shall be carried in accordance with the above specified maximum linear dimensions only.

5. Suitcases, briefcases, bags, pre-packed electrical goods (except TVs) are acceptable for carriage; as long as they do not exceed the aforesaid dimensions. Suitcases, etc. can be wrapped in the plastic wrap provided at Airport wrapping facilities.

6. TVs, with a maximum of 50 inches, in a pre-packed condition may be accepted.

7. Apart from cardboard boxes, the following will not be accepted for carriage:

- a. Improperly packaged items
- b. Irregular shaped items, wrapped in bedding/blankets
- c. Matted woven or plastic baggage
- d. Baggage without a flat surface/ball shaped

Please disseminate the same to your teams and reach out to all ticketed passengers informing them about the updated baggage policy.
